



## In the Examination Room

- Read the test paper carefully.
  - Use the time wisely.
  - Don't spend too much time on a question you don't know, or are not sure of the answer.
  - You can go back to it later if the time permits.
  - Don't explain something just because you know how to! You only earn marks for doing exactly what the question asks.
  - The number of lines of space is also a guide to know how much you are expected to write.
  - Follow the instructions given in the question. If it asks for one answer, give only one answer.
  - Don't mark more than one answer if your exam includes multiple-choice question.
  - Giving more than one choice will cancel out the question.
  - Ensure you give an answer to every question.
  - Talking without permission, laughing, causing disturbance in any form will result in immediate withdrawal of your test paper.
  - Come on time, you'll not be allowed to enter the examination room once the test papers are distributed.
  - Do the simple questions first to help build up your confidence for the harder ones.
  - **Concentrate-Concentrate, and concentrate** on your own test. It doesn't matter how fast other students finish their test.
  - If you don't know a question, skip it, you can come back to it later if you have time.
  - Try to answer questions with the most point value.
  - Focus on the question you are working on, don't let your mind wander on other things.
  - Review your test to make sure that you:
    - have answered all the questions
    - didn't mis-mark answers.
- Review will help you avoid careless or simple mistakes.
- Finally, believe in your abilities.

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**Here are some types of questions that you will see on the test papers:**

**Fill in the blanks questions:**

Write something! If you write something down, you may have a chance that it's right! Don't leave these blank

**Multiple Choice Questions:**

Read all questions and all answers carefully! Then, pick the best answer by the process of elimination.

There is only one right answer on MCQ!

**True/False:**

Just say true or false, don't tell why unless you are asked to do so. So read the instructions carefully!

**Short answer:**

Must be written in complete sentences and should be about a short paragraph long.

**Identifications:**

Must be written in complete sentences.


**Essay Questions:**

Broadly outline your answer and sequence the order of your points.

**NOTICE:**

Don't write more than is required. If the question asks for (3) three out of (5) five, then only answer three out of five! If you choose to write all five, we will only grade the first three.

**Always follow the instructions!**



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## Examination Techniques

### **In the weeks before the exam:**

- Attempt as many exercise papers as you can, so that you get to the style of timing.
- Revise thoroughly all related materials.

### **Just Before the Exams:**

Collect the equipment you will need:

- Two pens, in case one dries up.
- At least one sharpened pencil.
- An eraser, a ruler + corrector.
- A watch for pacing yourself during the exams.
- Fully charged calculator (for grades 7 →12) only.

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
